



This spooky-cute Halloween wreath uses just some of the paper and one piece of flair from your **Lisa's Picks Trick or Treat** kit. You will also need a circle punch, a hole punch, some twine or ribbon, a chipboard wreath base, adhesives, and some black acrylic paint.

1. The chipboard wreath measures 12-inches. Paint it black and let dry.
2. The paper circles on the wreath measure 2-inches each. Use a circle punch or cut 9 polkadot circles and 9 striped circles.
3. Before you glue any circles to the wreath, arrange them to get the most even spacing possible. In the wreath above, the circles overlap slightly. At the top of the wreath (which will be covered up by the bow), the circles will sit together unevenly. Don't worry about it!
4. For added charm, use a dimensional adhesive (like foam squares or "pop-dots") to stick down the polkadot circles.
5. Get all those circles glued in place!
6. Make the paper bow. Cut out bow pieces according to the template on the next page. bend the ends of the longer piece toward its center and glue in place. Glue the bow onto the bow base. Glue a "flair" button to the center of the bow and securely glue the bow to the top of the wreath.
7. Make the two tags. Cut out the "31" and the "spooky spooky" rectangles from your patterned paper. Cut each down to measure 2.5-inches across. Cut a 2.5-inch X 1.5-inch rectangle of striped paper and another of polkadot paper. Use these as the tops of the tags. Use cardstock borders as decorative trim on the bottom of each tag. Cut diagonal corners on the tops of the tags. Use a 1/2-inch piece of cardstock to create a sturdy center at the top of each tag where you will punch holes. Use the image above to guide your tag assembly.
8. Thread twine or ribbon through the tag holes and carefully loop them over the center of the bow.
9. Show off your wreath on social media, proudly display in your home or office, etc. Carefully store for future use next season.
