The Science Behind Crème Sticks

Crème Sticks moisturize your dog's ailments in a layered effect; first, ingredients made of smaller molecules soak in, then ingredients with medium molecules are absorbed and lastly, larger molecules act as a protective barrier. A variety of all-natural butters and oils found in our Crème Sticks, are absorbed at different rates for maximum moisturizing. They are infused with Calendula, Comfrey and St. John's Wort, which are known for their healing and supporting properties.

Elbow Crème

#USFT300001 - .5 oz. Stick / WS \$15.95; BV 13; QV 14

Moisturize and soften your dog's elbow calluses. Nourish damaged tissue with Calendula, Comfrey and St. John's Wort.

NOTE: Calluses are thick, rough overgrowth areas of skin over a bony area which are formed to protect the bone from injury. Hygromas are soft, fluid-filled subcutaneous sacks that form right where friction occurs. Both conditions are seen more often in larger dogs and dogs who prefer to recline on a hard surface. The elbow is the most common site of pressure sores, although they do also occur on the hips, hocks and along the sides of the legs.

Paw Crème

#USFT300002 - .5 oz. Stick / WS \$15.95; BV 13; QV 14

Treat dry, cracked paw pads with this intense moisturizer. Extra beeswax along with Calendula, Comfrey and St. John's Wort help heal and support paws.

NOTE: Footpad Hyperkeratosis appears as an overgrowth; like extra paw pad tissue growing on the sides of the pad. It may have a spiked or irregular appearance and texture. This is an idiopathic condition (unknown origin), but don't worry, Paw Crème moisturizes the excess tissue away.

Nose Crème

#USFT300003 - .5 oz. Stick / WS \$15.95; BV 13; QV 14

Crusty, cracked noses are healed with the extra butters and oils in this formula. This intense moisturizer absorbs at different rates to help heal all layers of skin.

TIP: Be FAST in applying Nose Crème. Many dogs loathe being controlled or held tightly. Flat-faced dogs often stress a bit more because their breathing is already compromised, so they instinctively try to prevent having their noses covered.

Ouch Crème

#USFT300004 - .5 oz. Stick / WS \$15.95; BV 13; QV 14

Treat scars, abrasions, scrapes, bug bites and more with this healing moisturizer.

TIP: While Ouch Crème is a rich balm, great for any issue that needs extra support, it is NOT intended for use on oozing areas, hot spots, or open, bleeding wounds. If you are unsure, seek the advice of your veterinarian.





How to Apply Crème Sticks

Apply 2-3 times a day for 2-3 days until area is healed. Then as needed for maintenance (1-3 times weekly on average).

Nose Crème: Dab a bit, that is appropriate for their nose size, across the top of the nose.

Paw Crème: Dab onto pad. Massage into pads, starting with largest pad, then each toe pad. Examine pads for cuts, lumps or bumps or foreign objects.

Elbow Crème: Clean callused area, and apply Elbow Crème. Massage into callus, if it is comfortable for your dog. Examine callus for cracks, infection or irregularities.

Ouch Crème: Clean affected area, and dab or swipe Ouch Crème on. Examine area for changes in appearance from one application to the next.

To keep your dog from licking crème off, try one of the following:



- Give a reward before and after application
- Feed them a meal
- Keep active! Go for a walk or play a game

Elbow Crème: Shea Butter, Olive Oil, Almond Oil, Coconut Oil, Beeswax, Avocado Oil, Cocoa Seed Butter, Castor Oil, Pumpkin Seed Oil, Infusions of St. John's Wort, Chamomile, Calendula, Comfrey, Youngevity Essential Oils.

Paw Crème: Shea Butter, Olive Oil, Almond Oil, Coconut Oil, Beeswax, Avocado Oil, Cocoa Seed Butter, Castor Oil, Infusions of St. John's Wort, Calendula, Comfrey, Youngevity Essential Oils.

Nose Crème: Shea Butter, Olive Oil, Almond Oil, Coconut Oil, Beeswax, Avocado Oil, Cocoa Seed Butter, Castor Oil, Youngevity Essential Oils.

Ouch Crème: Shea Butter, Olive Oil, Almond Oil, Coconut Oil, Beeswax, Avocado Oil, Cocoa Seed Butter, Castor Oil, Neem Oil, Argan Oil, Pumpkin Seed Oil, Infusions of St. John's Wort, Calendula, Comfrey, Youngevity Essential Oils.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What other factors contribute to my dog's dry nose?

A: Dry indoor heating or air conditioning, a more arid climate, a tendency to use their nose for rooting and digging, individual skin elasticity and possibly a slightly compromised immune system. Just as we have to reapply sunscreen or moisturizer, your dog's nose will continue to need extra moisturizing.

Q: What can be done about ugly dog elbow callus?

A: The best way to prevent pressure sores is to provide dogs with thick, comfy beds in areas where they usually rest. Elderly dogs or dogs that are physically-challenged should be given very soft, thick, well-padded beds to lie on, such as egg crate, foam-filled or special orthopedic dog beds. Just like bed-ridden people, you may have to physically turn an especially "bed-bound" dog every few hours to prevent "dog bed sores."

Q: Are Crème Sticks safe? What if my dog licks it off?

A: Nothing in the Crème Sticks will harm your dog (unless they have an individual reaction to a specific ingredient). Crème Sticks do need time to soak in and moisturize, so use the Distract & Divert Tips to keep them from licking it off.

Q: What can you do to keep your dog's feet happy?

A: Every couple of days look each pad over and ensure that there are no areas of concern (cracked, bleeding, suspicious bumps) or anything stuck in the pad. Carefully push on the pad to see if there is a reaction.
